



Almost ten years ago Donna Gomboc first heard the Harrisburg Men's Chorus perform, at the 1993 Pride Festival. She was so inspired that she asked to join them. Their director and other members offered to help her start a women's chorus, and the Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus was bom.

Donna made posters, placed ads, and organized meetings. She called interested singers repeatedly. She held fund-raisers. She sang in our very first performance, was on the task force that wrote our by-laws, and was a member of our very first board of directors. She continues to serve on the board today.

For years, Donna wrote a weekly update for singers. She has organized spaghetti dinners, Pride Festival booths, and yard sales. She attended national conferences of the Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses (GALA). She is such a quiet, self-deprecating "do-er" that we cannot possibly recite all that she has done for the chorus, because she has never told anyone.

As with any small organization of volunteers who care very much about their cause, our chorus family has had its moments of disagreement. Donna learned to overcome her natural shyness and speak her mind on questions of principle. She never became discouraged. Several years ago, when we lost a director and some suggested perhaps our time was over, she counselled the faint of heart to "Believe." Within just a few months of heeding that advice, we found ourselves singing backup for Judy Collins. The chorus is now stronger than ever.

The need to raise the money to buy music, pay our director and accompanists, print publicity, rent performance space, and meet the other fundamental needs of a performing arts organization can sap the energy of its members. For the past two years, Donna has conducted a weekly licensed bingo game under our nonprofit games of chance permit, enduring a smoke-filled room without complaint and staying up until the wee hours to be sure every nickel is accounted for.

She continues to serve on our board of directors and finally, this season, stepped out of the singing ranks to be sure she has the energy to continue to conduct our bingo games.

We are proud to dedicate this concert to our founding mother, Donna Gomboc. We thank her for sharing her dream with us, and for never abandoning it. We honor her gentle, strong spirit.

During World War Two, hundreds of Dutch, Australian, and British women who had been living in Sumatra, Malaya, and Singapore, were captured by the Japanese and held in a jungle prison camp. Among them were Dryburgh and Chambers, who used their musical training, talents, and memory to arrange (using stubs of pencils and scraps of paper) classical orchestral works for a "vocal orchestra". The chorus sang for a year, until half its members had died (Dryburgh among them). In recent years, this music was recorded and this moving story told in the movie, Paradise Road.

The Sanskrit text of Gaté Gaté appears at the end of the Prajñaparamita Heart Sutra and is generally regarded as the essence of Buddhist teaching. Gaté is "gone," gone from suffering to liberation, from forgetfulness to mindfulness, from duality to non-duality. Parasamgaté can be loosely translated as "the entire community of beings has gone over to the other shore." Bodhi is the light inside, enlightenment, or awakening. Svaha is a cry of joy or excitement, like "hallelujah."

In December 2000, Dan Krynak retired after ten years as Artistic Director of the Harrisburg Men's Chorus and became our director. In 1993, he was instrumental in founding our chorus, and served on our board for several years. He has led the two choruses in several major collaborations: Bendari, an African-based celebration of building community; Boys and Girls with Stories, a lesbian and gay musical; and in December 2000, singing with Judy Collins. He holds a Master's of Church Music from the University of Southern California and a Bachelor's degree from Westminster Choir College.






