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

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

Women Are Weavers was written by chorus member Florence March. Florence has written for the chorus before, most notably *Driven Women*. Flo said she wrote the song to express the awe she felt in having a woman run for President. "I realized that women have always been here, but only now are we finally stepping out and being recognized as leaders," she said. She uses the weaving image because of the importance of women in the fabric of our culture. "Women operate by weaving together and creating, rather than by conquering," she said.

Weaving has been associated with women in many cultures and times. Until the Industrial Revolution, weaving of clothes and baskets were important contributors to household economies. In Revolutionary era America, the boycott of British goods, including inexpensive manufactured cloth, meant that more women went back to home production of cloth. Spinning wheels were a symbol of independence and freedom. The Industrial Revolution began, in large part, as mechanization of the production of textiles, and so this change in weaving and cloth-making production meant immense changes in women's lives — and may have helped give rise to the movements for women's rights.

### Song Notes...

**Duerme Negrito** is a Latin American lullaby sung by a slave mother to her "Little Black One" ("darling" or "dear little son"). Her pathos is felt through the litany of what she would bring to her son, if she only she were paid for her labor and she were not sick. She uses a scare tactic in the lullaby, saying her son would have his foot eaten by a "white devil," if he didn't go to sleep. The divide between the two cultures is a huge one. The language is that of the black Spanish spoken in the slave culture. The reference to the foot being cut off (to prevent a slave's escape) and the lack of wages underscore the dehumanizing conditions faced for centuries by slaves throughout the New World.

**Beau Soir (Beautiful Evening).** Claude Debussy, only 16 at the time, was inspired by a poem by the French poet and novelist Paul Bourget to write this art song. Here is the English translation:

When 'neath the setting sun glows a river in evening, and the warm southern wind blows out across the field. Then from all things a thought arises to be happy, and it counsels the troubled heart.

And it tells us we should enjoy the gift of living while we're young and the sun is setting in full bloom.

For we shall go away, like water that is flowing.

It to the sea, we to the tomb.
