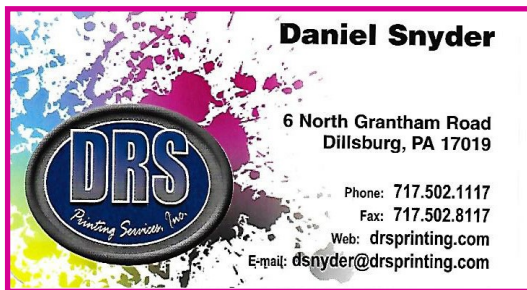

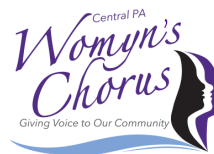
Renee Bartholomew, percussion, and **Pat George, percussion and bass,** have played with many area bands. They often join CPWC's performances.

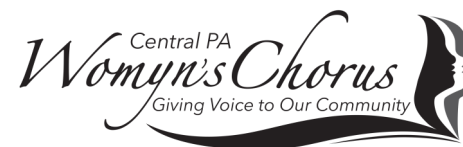
