The Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus is excited to present Simply Sondheim! Just as the word "Broadway" evokes the theatre experience – the anticipation of a live performance and being moved by music - the name "Sondheim" presents us the exhilarating experience of unconventional story lines,

strong female characters with depth, unexpected themes delivered with complexity and sophistication.

Stephen Sondheim is one of the greatest American musical theatre composers and lyricists of all time. He reinvented the American musical by introducing a new type of musical heroine in the musical "Gypsy" – helping musical theatre to evolve and tell more nuanced stories of complicated humans. He continued to write strong female characters who bucked the norms of society – Cinderella walking away from royalty in "Into the Woods," Mrs. Lovett enabling the murderous Sweeney Todd so she could profit from his treachery, and Dot from "Sunday in the Park with George" refusing to allow herself to be mistreated by the artist.

Our members are excited to be performing pieces by Sondheim. He wrote interesting music – unique melodies and harmonies, syncopated rhythms, and challenging lyrics which are best performed with precise diction. And I can personally attest, we each put in a ton of time – both individually and in rehearsal together - to bring this music to life for you this weekend! We are thrilled to perform these pieces for you and hope you enjoy the experience of them as much as we have.

The Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus brings together a diverse group of women, united by the joy of singing, to celebrate and empower women, and to affirm a positive image of lesbians and feminists.



In **Simply Sondheim**, the Central Pennsylvania Womyn's Chorus honors the lyrical work and music of the Broadway musicals of Stephen Sondheim. Stephen Sondheim was a prolific lyricist whose words created complex musical themes and intricate rhyme schemes. His genius produced indelible imprints of musicals that captured his perplexing, passionate, and sometimes aloof characterizations of individuals traveling through life.

Pausing on a <u>Sunday</u>, this performance will take you to a picturesque <u>Sunday in the</u> <u>Park</u>, a portrait of folks with parasols, strolling on the colorful grasses along the waters.

Come with us as we travel Into the Woods of

fractured fairy tales to gather our "wishes" to go to the festival of life, knowing that along the way, we will encounter "wolves and witches and giants," fears to distract us our journey. Even though we may feel the <u>Agony</u> of elusive love, and seek potions to reverse spells, we find the care of strangers on our side for <u>No One is Alone</u>. As we emerge from darkness in the <u>Last Midnight</u>, we know that there is a place for us <u>Somewhere</u>.



And if there's a pause on this journey, just <u>Send in the Clowns</u>, until maybe next year, for it's <u>Our Time</u>, we breathe it in, we have worlds to change. When <u>Everybody Says Don't</u> – don't rock the boat, or make a noise - we say don't be afraid, insist on miracles cause we're doing just fine.

We conclude our Sondheim tribute in telling the dark, whimsical <u>Ballad of Sweeney</u> <u>Todd</u>, a demon barber seeking revenge as he contributes to <u>The Worst Pies of</u> <u>London</u>. Deceit and betrayal all play out in hopes for love and justice expressed to <u>Johanna and Pretty Women</u>, in a new life <u>By the Sea</u>. Optimism is expressed that demons will not bring harm <u>Not While I'm Around</u>.

So careful the tales we tell and the spells we make for <u>Children Will Listen</u>, as children are wishes of which way to go, to learn and what to be.

**Conductor,** studied at The Peabody Conservatory of The Johns Hopkins University and Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania. He is a classically-trained singer, having studied under Grammy-winning baritone William Sharp and soprano Susan Solomon Beckley of Bucknell University. He was a chorister at The National Cathedral and a chorister and soloist in The Handel Choir of Baltimore. Throughout the past decade, Jordan has performed with The Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, as well as at Carnegie Hall, the Boston Symphony Hall, and the Jackie Gleason Theatre. He has been active in the musical scene for the past decade directing, accompanying, and acting in theaters throughout Pennsylvania and Maryland. He is currently serving as Director of Music & Organist at St Stephen's Episcopal Cathedral in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Tyler A. Canonico, Collaborative Pianist, is hailed as "one of east coast's finest young concert organists and inspiring church musicians." Tyler is the Minister of Music and Organist at Market Square Presbyterian Church in downtown Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, where he leads an expansive music program. In addition to his work, he is the organist for the Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra, the founder and co-conductor of The Harrisburg Camerata, serves on the American Guild of Organists' national committee for Pipe Organ Encounters, is the Sub Dean for the Harrisburg AGO Chapter, and is a frequent concert artist and guest conductor throughout the country. His education includes a Master of Music in organ performance from the University of Alabama and a Bachelor of Arts in organ performance and sacred music from Lebanon Valley College.
